Captein fenton coming by sea to help his men, whome he heard to bee distressed 5 by the enemy, was in the way intercepted, all his men slayne, him self taken, or killed. / Also the Rebelles haue layd siege to the 10 Castle of Bentrey, / There is lately Come out of Spayne vnto the Rebelles one Henry Mobryen a Priest. / The same hath likewise bene aduertized by Thomas Burgate & otheres, that there 15 is a Bishop come from the Pope to Arlogh, appointed for Corke & Cloyne and that he giveth forth that an Army of iiij^C Saile is to come from Spayne into this Realme this Sommer. / 20

Note on hands

The first of the endorsements is in Spenser's italic hand; Carew (among whose papers this letter is filed) seems to have added the second of the endorsements, at the top left of the main text, in his own italic hand.
