In a period when the English and Irish book trades were increasing their political and commercial importance, no one had a sharper eye for print's expressive and satirical potential than Swift. Papers at this conference will review his relationship to books, query his literary and booktrade contexts, detail new research on eighteenth-century editions of Shakespeare and Spenser, and reflect the editing of volumes in the Cambridge Swift.
